NESCS 2022 Recap. No sense in burying the lede here: March 18 and 19 saw the first NESCS since 2019, and while it may have been one small line item on the national show choir calendar, it was one giant leap towards a post-Covid normal. Thank you to all the alumni and friends of

the program for coming back and making it all happen!

For a majority of the current kids in AVM, it was their first taste of the energy that overtakes the Collins Center during NESCS weekend. During FSTF's set on Saturday night, the noise levels regularly hit between 105 and 110 decibels, which sits roughly between a chainsaw and a jackhammer, and is the type of volume that will cause hearing damage after 30 minutes of exposure. - BTB: 2:30 PM ET
- <u>NBT</u>: 4:30 PM ET
- <u>FSTF</u>: 7:00 PM ET

By now you know the drill: these competitions can (and frequently do) fall behind schedule, so our crews may not take the stage when they're scheduled to perform. That being said, BTB is the first competitor to take the stage in the Single-Gender Division, so they're more likely than usual to be on time. As of press time no livestream link has been released, but we're expecting to see one. When we do, we will post it to our social media channels, so for now, mark your calendars, and hope to see you in person or online on Saturday!
